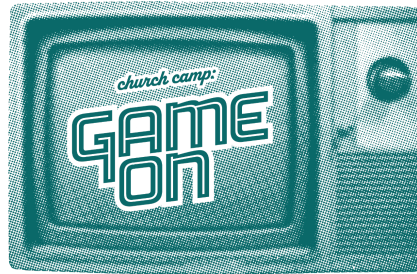


2024 ORPAC HS & MS Camp Information

Late registration: Student registrations received after June 23rd must pay a \$30 late fee
Counselor registrations received after June 23rd must pay a \$50 late fee

Students going into 9th grade in the fall may choose whether they want to go to Middle School or High School Camp, but they cannot go to both.

Payments: All payments should be made to your local church.

Cancellations: Any cancellations after July 1, 2024, for either camp will still be required to pay half of the camp cost (\$150).

Scholarships: Fifteen \$50 scholarships will be provided for each camp. Requests will be accepted until **June 1st** and will be evaluated on a first come first serve basis.

Youth Leader Information

How and where do we pay?

The cost for Adult Counselors/Youth Leaders is \$0 this year. Churches should write one check to ORPAC NYI for all of your students (\$300 per student + any \$30 late fees) and adults (\$0 + any \$50 late fees) attending camp. *No payments will be made online. **Please inform families to pay their local church.*** An invoice will be sent to the local Youth Pastors/Leaders by July 1st. How to Register as a Counselor or Volunteer:

1. Volunteer/counselor registration will be online at: nyi.orpac.org
2. Volunteers/counselors will register under the "Counselor/Staff Registration" link. These registrations are also **DUE BY JUNE 23**. Late counselor/volunteer registrations will be charged \$50 per late registration.
3. Adults must meet approved guidelines set by the ORPAC district to attend ORPAC camps as counselors. Anyone who wishes to be a counselor must fill out the ORPAC NYI Camp Counselor Registration form online, have 2 references (1 pastoral and 1 personal), **complete our District background check on ORPAC's website**, and meet the minimum age requirement (18 for middle school, 21 for high school). ***Depending on the need, filling out the application does not guarantee you will be a counselor at camp.***

How many leaders do we need to bring?

If you send 2 or fewer students to camp, we can partner them up with a counselor from another church. Otherwise, plan on sending a counselor for the week. **If you are unable to send an adult counselor with your 3+ students, your church will be required to pay \$120 for a counselor provided by camp staff/camp directors. You must also have a representative from your church available over the phone at all hours for the duration of camp in case an incident arises with one of your students.**

For every 8 students you send to camp, you must send an additional counselor.

When is Counselor Orientation this year?

Counselor Orientation will now be held via Zoom on **Monday, June 24th** at either Noon or 7 pm (you choose which time slot works best for you).

Arrival Times: Adults and Students should arrive at camp together between 2-3:30 pm on Monday, July 15 for MS Camp and Monday, July 29 for HS Camp.

Departure Time: Camps will end at 11:00 am Friday, July 19 for MS Camp and Friday, August 2nd for HS Camp.
